"YOUNG @ HEART" (PG) USA. Musical Documentary. Dir: Stephen Walker.

Featuring The Senior Citizens Choir from Northampton, Massachusetts.

"THE SQUARE" (MA) Aust. Thriller/Crime Drama. Dir: Nash Edgerton.

Screens: 2 Nights ONLY: Fri 9th & Sun 11th Jan. Escaping the monotony of a loveless marriage Raymond Yale has become entangled in an affair with the beautiful but troubled Carla. Ray's moral limits are tested when Carla presents him with the proceeds of her controlling husband's latest crime. This is their chance: Take the money and run..... IF only it were that simple!! Some things just cannot be buried.

"EDGE OF LOVE" (M) UK. Human Drama. Dir: John Maybury.

Screens: 2 Nights ONLY: Thurs 15th & Sat 17th Jan. During WW2, poet Dylan Thomas is reunited with his childhood sweetheart, a situation complicated by the fact that the errant poet is married. A story of strong female friendship, often powerful, stirring & dwelling in the borders of emotion in this lush portrait of London during the blitz. "MAN ON WIRE" (PG) UK. True Story. Dir: Kathy O'Donnell. Based on the Book "To Reach The Clouds"

Screens: 2 Nights ONLY: Fri 16th & Sun 18th Jan. On August 7th 1974, a young Frenchman named Philippe Petit stepped out onto a wire illegally rigged between New York's World Trade Centre Twin Towers, then the world's tallest buildings. After nearly an hour dancing on the wire, he was finally arrested, taken for psychological evaluation, then brought to jail & finally released. "A riveting film... "IN THE SHADOW OF THE MOON" (G) USA. Documentary. Dir: David Sington.

Screens: 2 Nights ONLY: Thurs 22nd & Sat 24th Jan. On Jan 27th 1967 during the Space Race between the USSR and USA three American astronauts lost their lives in a tragic accidental fire whilst practicing moon landing techniques in their space capsule at Cape Canaveral. Their loss spurred the Apollo program even more and from 1968 until 1972 nine American spacecraft voyaged to the Moon & 12 men walked upon it's surface. They remain the only human beings to have EVER stood on another world. This film brings together those surviving men to tell their stories. The film also brings together much archival material never seen before from original NASA footage remastered & presented on the big screen. Compelling, gripping & a reminder of what is still mankind's greatest achievement.

"THE VIEW FROM GREENHAVEN" (PG) Aust. Comedy/Drama. First Release of this Film in WA.
